

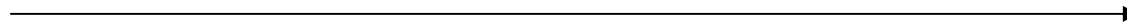

LI 100: ELECTRONIC INFORMATION RESOURCES

Student Level: All levels

Instructor:

Team taught by librarians

Main Goals:

- A broad based examination of research sources, techniques, and strategies.
- Investigates the structures of scholarly and disciplinary information systems.
- Addresses the social, political, and economic issues of the information age.

SUBJECT CLASSES (BIs)

(B.I. = Bibliographic Instruction)

Student Level:

All levels: From introductory, gateway classes including MB107 and EN 105 to advanced classes at the 300 level.

Instructor: Subject librarians

Main goals:

- Deliver subject-based library instruction for discipline specific research.
- Demonstrate relevant electronic resources
- Prepare students for assignments that include a formal research component.

The BIs focus is to show students **HOW** to use the library in order to conduct discipline specific research.

LI371/372: INDEPENDENT STUDY

(one credit course)

Student Level: Juniors and Seniors

Instructor:

Taught one-on-one by subject librarians.

Main Goals:

- Prepare students for projects that require a serious research component.
- Students will be instructed in the organization of information and in sophisticated search strategies for finding, evaluating, and using information.
