

Internship for Credit Faculty Means of Assessment

The faculty sponsor will develop and submit a means of assessment which outlines how they will judge the proposed internship for academic credit in a liberal arts context.

The following should be included:

- 1. A description of the materials upon which credit will be assessed and a grade assigned.
- 2. All journals, papers or other coursework to be completed by the student.
- 3. Faculty name, Department or Program, student name, and date.

Suggestions for Means of Assessment Based on Number of Credits

- 1 credit Weekly journal entries. Two research or analytical papers, one submitted at the mid-point of the term and the second at the end of the internship. Topics chosen by the faculty sponsor. Each paper should be approximately 2-3 pages in length.
- **2 credits** Weekly journal entries. Assigned readings designed to help the student reflect upon, analyze, and integrate their internship experience with their liberal arts education. Two research papers, one submitted at the mid-point of the term and second at the end of the internship. Topics chosen by the faculty sponsor. Each paper should be approximately 3-5 pages in length.
- **3 credits** Weekly journal entries. Assigned readings designed to help the student reflect upon, analyze, and integrate their internship experience with their liberal arts education. Two research papers, one submitted at the mid-point of the term and second at the end of the internship. Topics chosen by the faculty sponsor. Each paper should be approximately 5-7 pages in length.
- **4 credits** Weekly journal entries. Assigned readings designed to help the student reflect upon, analyze, and integrate their internship experience with their liberal arts education. Two research papers, one submitted at the mid-point of the term and second at the end of the internship. Topics chosen by the faculty sponsor. Each paper should be approximately 6-8 pages in length.
