Spring 2021**

In Fall 2020, the Title IX Coordinator in collaboration with the Offices of the Dean of Students, Health Promotions, and Sponsored Research administered the Sexual and Gender-Based Misconduct Survey for Skidmore College.

This survey covered several topic areas including: demographics, personal views related to Skidmore’s sexual and gender-based misconduct (SGBM) policies, and personal experiences with SGBM specific to Skidmore students. The results are intended to assess student understanding of and knowledge about the policies and the prevalence of sexual misconduct experiences among our students as well as inform policy adjustments for the future.

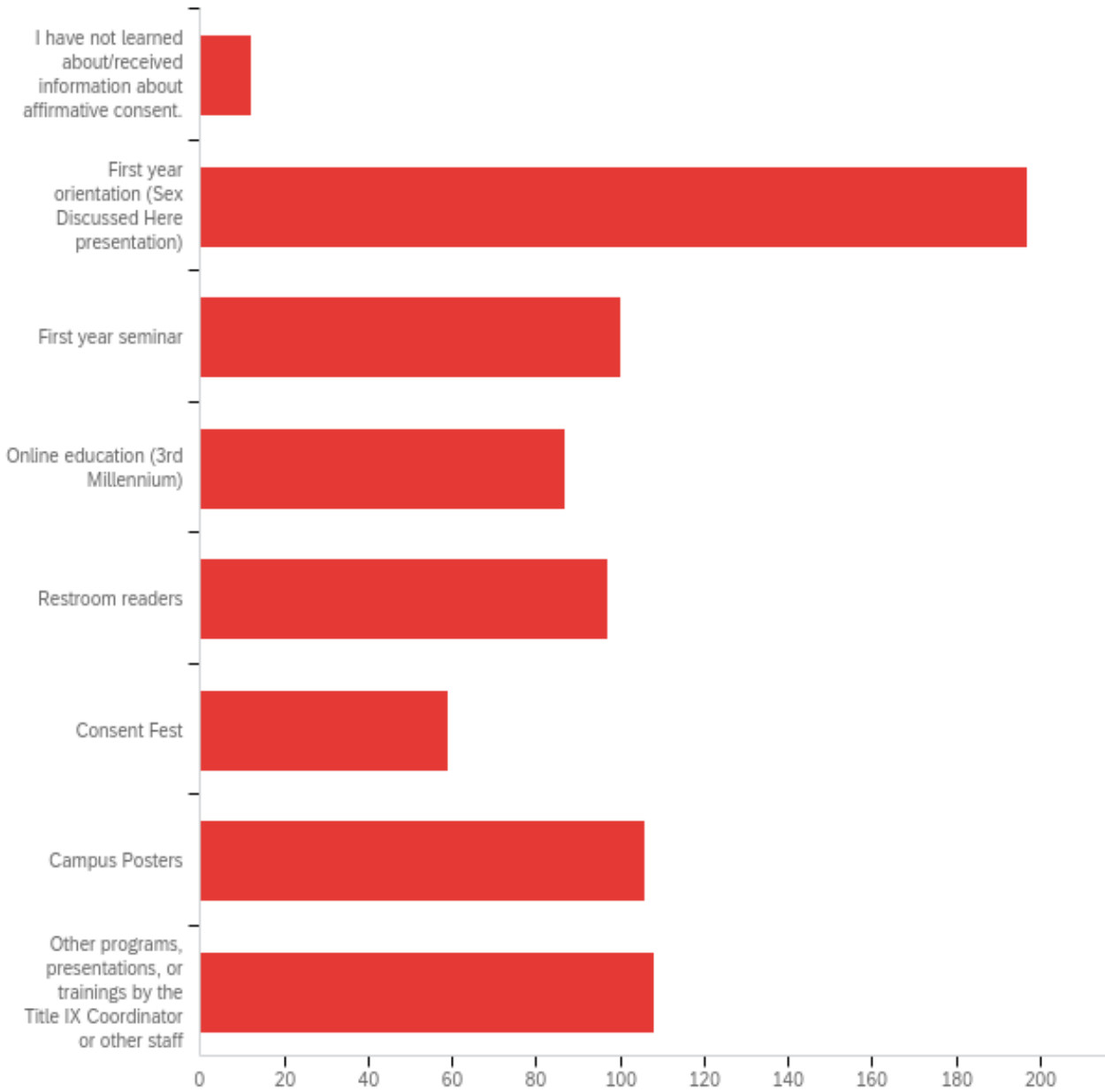
For this survey, 336 students out of an approximate student body of 2,582 agreed to participate in this study, representing an approximate 13% response rate, though participants were not required to answer every question and were able to stop their participation in the survey at any time. The following information is from those participants who chose to answer and/or self-identify:

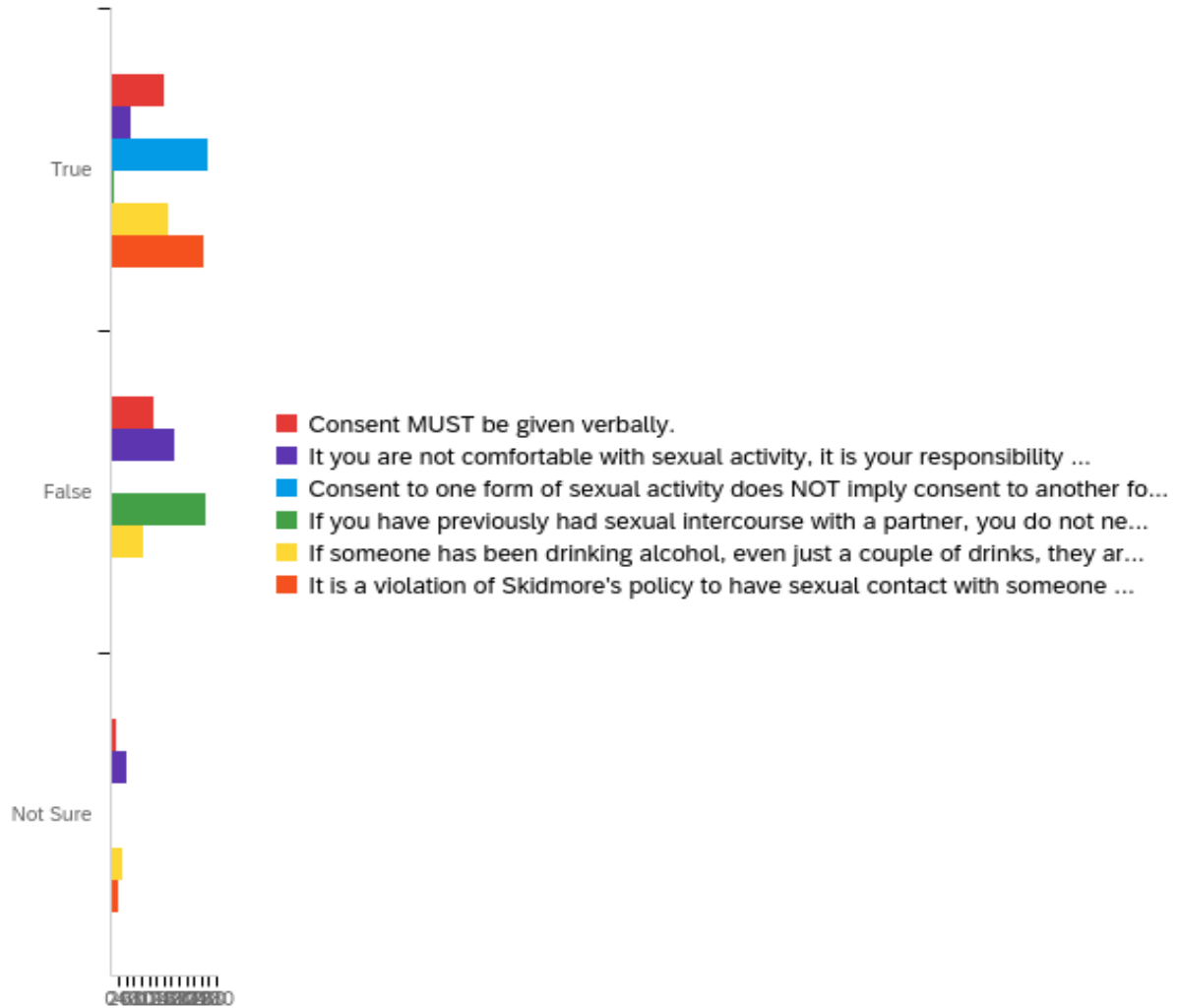

## *Prevalence of Sexual and Gender-Based Misconduct<sup>1</sup>*

### Sexual Touching, Disrobing, and/or Exposure:

- Out of 78 responses to this section, 26.97% of participants reported having experienced some form of unwanted sexual touching, disrobing, and/or exposure
- 10.26% told a confidential resource, 10.26% filed a report with the College, and no one filed with law enforcement. 74.36% did not report.
- Approximately half of these described that they encountered another instances of unwanted sexual touching, disrobing, and/or exposure with the majority not reporting the second instance.

### Sexual Harassment:

- Out of 264 responses to this section, 17.42% of participants reported having experienced sexual harassment.
- 10.87% told a confidential resource, 8.70% filed a report with the College, and approximately 2 percent filed with law enforcement. 78.26% did not report.
- 23.91% experienced a second instance of sexual harassment with the majority not reporting.

### Sexual Exploitation:

- Out of 263 responses to this section, 4.94% of participants reported having experienced sexual exploitation
- 7.69% told a confidential resource, 15.38% filed a report with the College, and no one filed with law enforcement. 76.92% did not report to anyone.
- 15.38% experienced a second instance of sexual exploitation with none reporting.

### Sexual Penetration:

- Out of 262 responses to this section, 9.54% of participants reported having experienced sexual penetration without consent.
- 11.54% told a confidential resource, 15.38% filed a report with the College, and no one filed with law enforcement. 65.38% did not report to anyone.
- 21.92% experienced a second instance of sexual penetration without consent with none reporting.

### Dating and Domestic Violence:

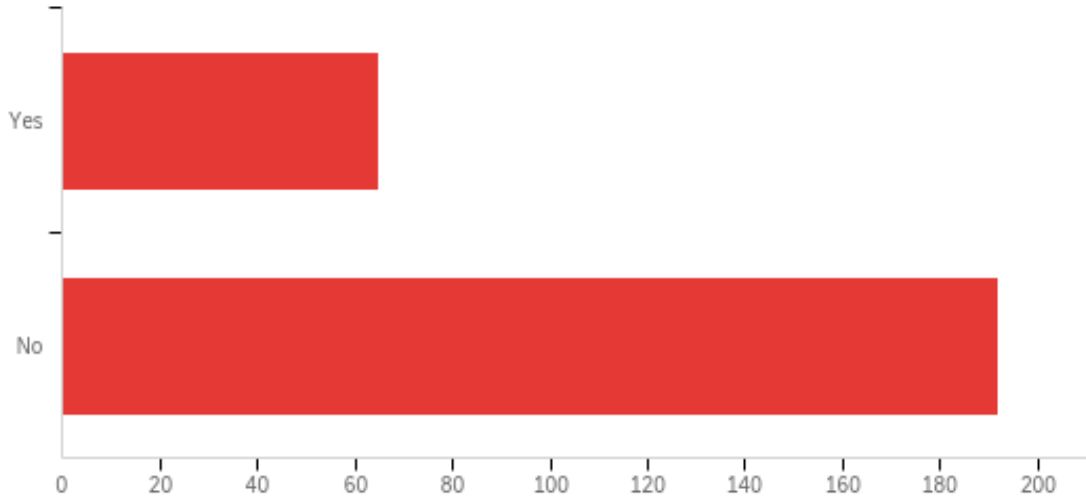
- Out of 262 responses to this section, 10.34% of participants reported having experienced dating or domestic violence.
- 3.57% told a confidential resource, 15.38% filed a report with the College, and 3.57% filed with law enforcement. 75% did not report to anyone.
- 21.43% experienced a second instance of dating or domestic violence with the majority not reporting.

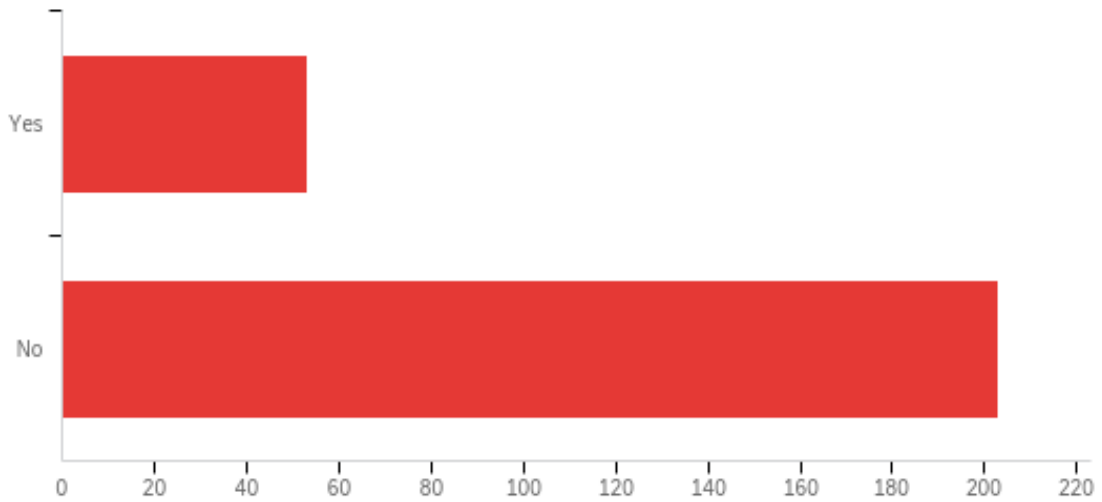

During your time at Skidmore, have you felt pressured into having sex (oral, anal, or vaginal)?



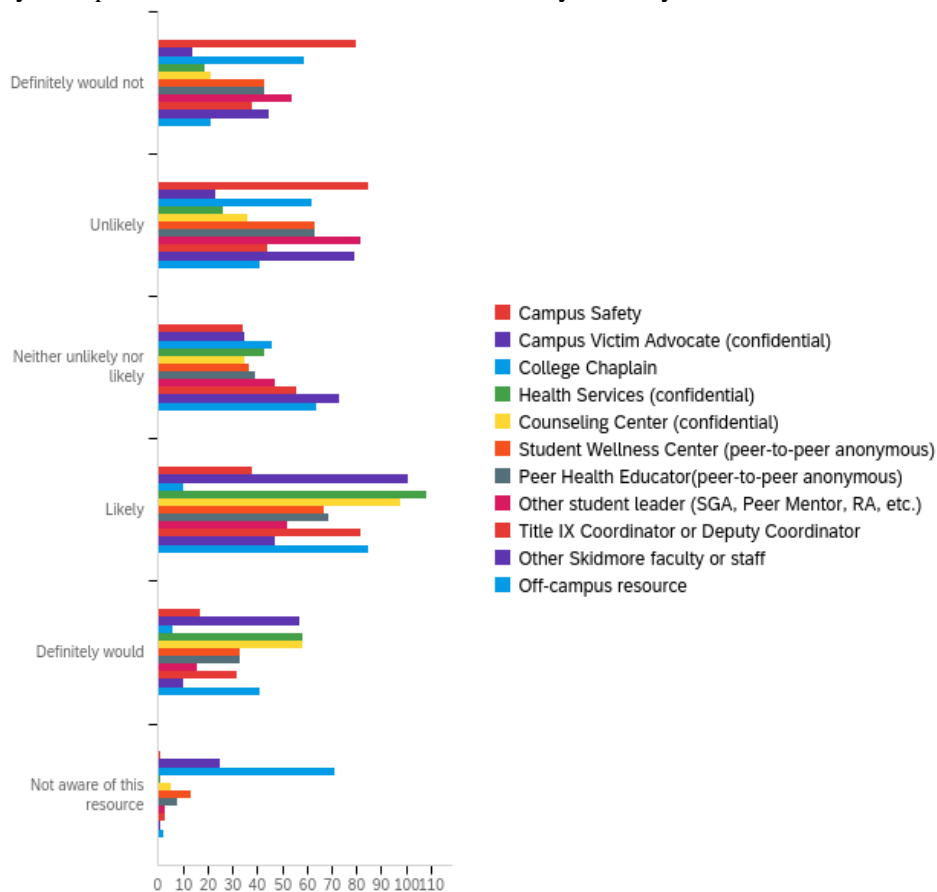
During your time at Skidmore, have you had sex when you didn't want to (oral, anal, or vaginal)?



On average, how often during a Skidmore semester do you witness the following:

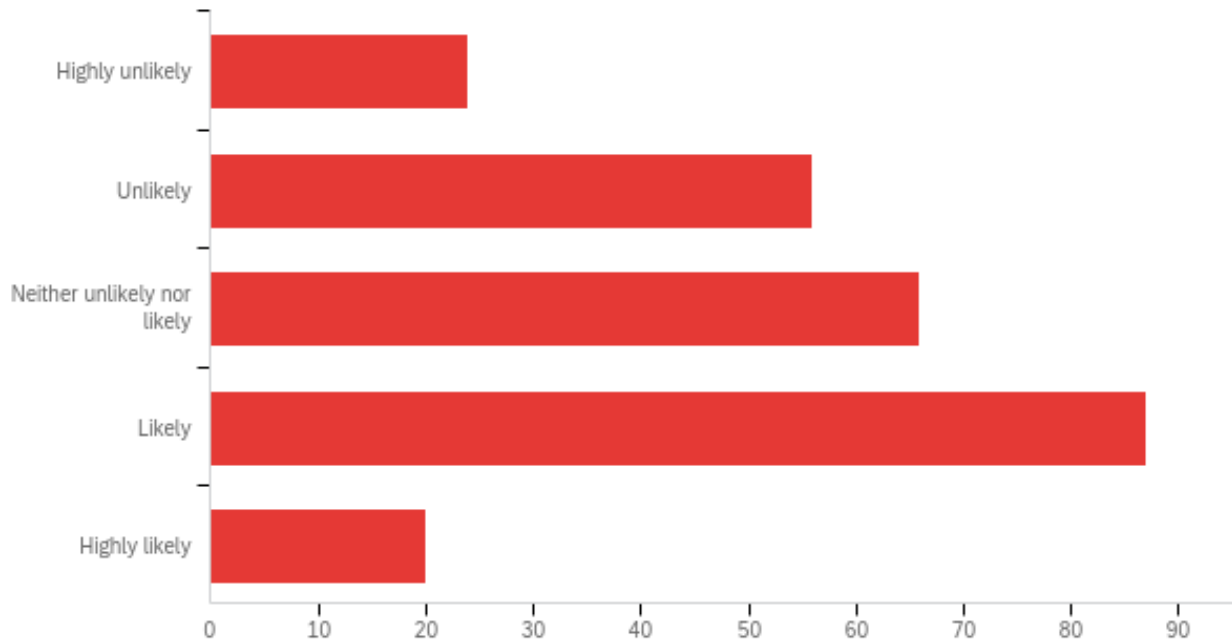

For participants who provided an additional category to self-identify, those were as follows:

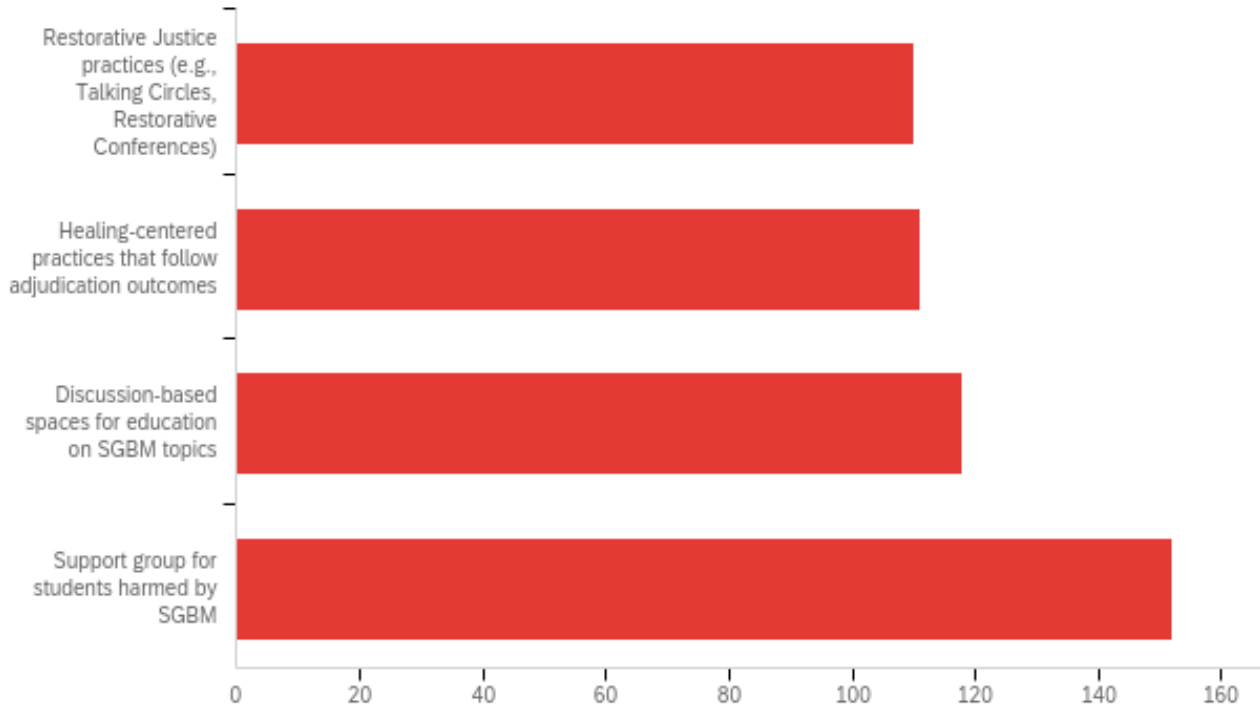
- Gender Identity: Nonbinary, NB, and Gender-fluid

- Race: Mixed or Mixed Race

There were a few additional self-identifying demographic categories provided that could not be included due to privacy. Additionally, 5.84% of participants identified as international students, and participants by class year were comparable across all years.
