

## Anthropology Major 4-Year Planning Guide (Declaration in 1st or 2nd Year)

For students who started Fall 2020 and after.

This guide is *one* scenario for students declaring the Anthropology Major by the end of their 2nd year. Actual course schedule can vary. Majors must complete at least 11 courses and 33 credits in Anthropology. To meet the minimum total course load of 120 credits, students must take an average of 15 credits per semester. Students taking fewer than 15 credits in a semester may take more credits in another semester, which may include a summer session.
