



Getting the Right Care



Choosing a Primary Care Physician (PCP) is one of the most important decisions you can make about your health care. Your PCP is your partner in health. He or she will work with you to manage all of your health care needs and should be your first choice for your medical care.



Primary Care Physician

Go to your **PCP** for regular care, chronic conditions, vaccines, and checkups, and most urgent care during office hours.

Examples include:

- Cough
- Sinus infection
- Digestive disorders
- Sore throat
- Earache/ear infection
- Minor injuries
- Headache
- Urinary tract infection
- Sore joints



When your PCP's Office is Closed...

An **Urgent Care Center** can provide care for less serious illnesses. Examples include:

- Cuts that need stitches
- Possible broken bones
- Sprains
- Painful conditions

Go to the **Emergency Room** for serious or life-threatening illnesses and acute care, including, but not limited to:

- Chest pain or shortness of breath
- Serious injuries
- Bleeding you can't stop
- Head injuries



What it Might Cost

For the following diagnoses for MVP members: Acute Upper Respiratory Infection, Fever, Headache, or Urinary Tract Infection.

Hospital Owned Urgent Care	\$227.90
Urgent Care	\$173.28
