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Follow Up Data Summary for the Class of 2010

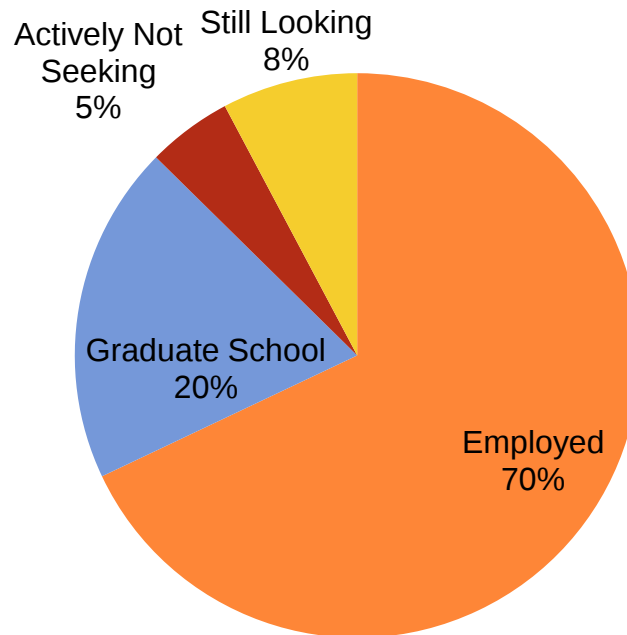
INTRODUCTION

This report is a profile of the Class of 2010 summarizing their career and graduate school pursuits. This data was collected from a variety of campus sources as well as questionnaires mailed/emailed and telephone calls made from May 2010 to May 2011. Data was ultimately collected from 76% of the Class. 61% of those tracked were women and the remaining 39% were men. Women made up 57% of the Class so the gender balance of those tracked reflects the overall class nicely.

Readers of this report are cautioned not to make predictions about future outcomes for Skidmore students based on this data. Although the percentage of the Class which was tracked was reasonably high, it would be risky to extrapolate from the 76% of the Class of 2010 for whom data was collected. Since the mechanism for generating responses was a voluntary one, it is likely that there are some biases reflected in the data which was secured about the Class and it is difficult to know the precise profile of the remaining 24% of the Class for whom no data was collected.

Employment Summary



Based on a 76% response rate.

The two top areas of pursuit for the Class of 2010 were employment in Business followed by jobs in the field of Education. The Arts was the third most popular category of employment followed by Health/Science, Government/Law, Human Services/Social Work, and Communications.

25% of those tracked were working in Business, while Education attracted 14% of the group. 7% of those tracked had jobs in the Arts, 7% in Health/Science, 5% in both Government/Law and Human Services, and 4% in Communications.

The employment distribution for the Class of 2010 was similar than the profile of the Class of 2009. Employment in Business increased slightly from 21% to 24% while employment in Communications, an area severely impacted by the recession, continued to suffer, declining from 5% to 4%. Employment in the fields of Government/Law, Human Services, the Arts and Health /Science was virtually unchanged.

Unemployment rose to 8% from 6% in the prior year, however, Skidmore graduate unemployment rate is still below the national average of 9.7% for college grads under the age of 25 (Economic Policy Institute, 2010). 5% of respondents were voluntarily out of the work force, unchanging from the percentage recorded for the Class of 2009.

Within the Business/Industry category, the most common areas of work were Sales/Marketing at 27%, followed by Banking/Finance at 24%, and Consulting and Sports/Hospitality both at 14%. Computer was the next most popular category with 10%. 5% of those tracked were employed in Other Business Fields, 3% in Manufacturing, 2% in Real Estate, and 1% in Insurance.

INTERNSHIPS AND EMPLOYMENT

48% of those tracked had completed internships by graduation, up from 46% in the previous data collection. Only 52% of the unemployed had completed internships while 48% of the employed had done so.

GRADUATE STUDY SUMMARY

20% of those tracked were pursuing graduate study, increasing from the 18% figure that was registered for the Class of 2009 and consistent with the long-term average for graduate study. An average of 17% of those tracked for the classes of 1999-2009 indicated that they were pursuing graduate study.

The Class of 2010 went on to study at many of the nation's leading institutions including Brown, Columbia, Fordham, Georgetown, Harvard, John Hopkins, London School of Economics, Michigan State, New York University, Rutgers, Thomas Jefferson, Tufts, University of Alaska at Fairbanks, University of Lancashire, and Yale. The most popular programs were Education, Law, Science, Nursing, Social Work, and Art. See Appendices E and F for a complete breakdown of graduate school pursuit by discipline.

GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION SUMMARY

Graduates of the Class of 2010 started work or graduate study in 32 different states and 20 foreign countries. 62% were residing in the Northeast/Mid Atlantic region, mostly in the Boston to Washington corridor. New York was by far the most popular state with 38% of graduates residing in that state. Massachusetts was the next most popular destination with 45% of graduates living there. 3% of those tracked lived in California, DC, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania, 2% in Connecticut and Vermont. 1% of those tracked were living in each of these areas: Alaska, Colorado, Illinois, Maryland, Michigan, North Carolina, New Hampshire, Ohio, Rhode Island, Texas, and Wyoming. China was the most common location for those working abroad with 17 respondents residing there followed by 4 in the UK, and 3 in Chile. GENDER DIFFERENCES

There were some significant differences between the responses of females and males to the survey. Men were more likely to be working in Business (35% vs. 18%) and Government/Law (7% vs. 4%). Women were more likely to be working in Education (16% vs. 9%) and Communications (4% vs. 3%). Figures for males and females were similar in other areas of employment. Unemployment was higher for males at 9% vs. 8% for females.
