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FOLLOW UP DATA SUMMARY – CLASS OF 2011

REPORTING HIGHLIGHTS

Employment Trends:

- **Entrepreneurship:** 5% of the Class of 2011 reported self-employment, suggesting the foundations of entrepreneurship begin immediately after graduation. The most recent 5-year out data from the Class of 2006 reported 7% self-employment.
- **Unemployment:** Unemployment decreased from 8% in the Class of 2010 to 3% in the Class of 2011. According to the U.S. Department of Labor, in collaboration with Northeastern University, Drexel University, the Economic Policy Institute, and the Census Bureau's Current Population Survey (2012), about 1.5 million, or 53.6% of bachelor's degree-holders under the age of 25 last year were jobless or underemployed, the highest share in at least 11 years. 80% of respondents reported employment.
- **Top Employers:** Employers hiring the most Skidmore graduates from the Class of 2011 included: Skidmore Teach in China (16), Teach for America (5), The Peace Corps (3), NYU Langone Medical Center (3), Cultural Services of French Embassy (3), EF Education First (3), and Three Group Market Research LLC (3).

Internships:

- **Top Internship Sites:** Sites that provided the most liberal learning practices included: Skidmore Collaborative Research (19), Skidmore College (8), Emma Dodge Hansen Photography (7), Student Teaching (5), and Saratoga Hospital (3).

Graduate School:

- **Top Graduate Schools:** 19% of the Class of 2011 pursued graduate school within one year. The most popular graduate schools attended were New York University (10), Columbia University (7), Boston University (4), and University of Pennsylvania (3).
- **Advanced Study:** 17% of those attending graduate school immediately were pursuing J.D., M.D., or Doctoral Programs, in fields such as: Dental Medicine, Law, Chemistry, Computer Science, Neuroscience, Medicine, and Psychology.

Geographic Distribution:

- **Global Impact:** 9% of respondents reported working or pursuing graduate school abroad, in locations including: China, United Kingdom, France, Senegal, South Africa, Denmark, Israel, Japan, and Peru.

INTRODUCTION

This report is a profile of the Class of 2011 summarizing their career and graduate school pursuits. This data was collected from a variety of campus sources as well as questionnaires emailed and telephone calls made from May 2010 to May 2011. Data was collected from 76% of the Class. 62% of those tracked were women and 38% were men.

EMPLOYMENT SUMMARY

80% of respondents reported employment. The two top areas of pursuit for the Class of 2011 were employment in Business followed by jobs in the field of Education. The Arts was the third most popular category of employment followed by Health/Science, Communications, Government/Law, Self-Employed, Civic Engagement/Human Services, and Social Work.

30% of those tracked were working in Business, while Education attracted 18% of the group. 14% of those tracked had jobs in the Arts, 9% in Health/Science, 7% in Communications, 5% in both Government/Law and Self Employed, 4% in both Civic Engagement/Human Services and Social Work.

Unemployment decreased from 8% in the Class of 2010 to 3% in the Class of 2011. According to the U.S. Department of Labor, in collaboration with Northeastern University, Drexel University, the Economic Policy Institute, and the Census Bureau's Current Population Survey (2012), about 1.5 million, or 53.6% of bachelor's degree-holders under the age of 25 last year were jobless or underemployed, the highest share in at least 11 years. 1% of respondents were voluntarily out of the work force, decreasing from the Class of 2010.

Within the Business & Industry Distribution, the most common areas of work were Banking/Finance at 31%, followed by Sales/Retail/Marketing at 26%, and Sports/Hospitality at 16%, and Other at 8%. Computer and Consulting were the next two most popular categories, with 6% each. 4% of those tracked were employed in Manufacturing, and 2% in Insurance.

GRADUATE STUDY SUMMARY

19% of those tracked were pursuing graduate study, decreasing from the 20% figure that was registered for the Class of 2010, and consistent with the long-term average for graduate study. An average of 17% of those tracked for the classes of 1999-2009 indicated that they were pursuing graduate study within a year after graduation.

The Class of 2011 went on to study at many leading institutions including Boston University, Columbia University, Dartmouth College, Harvard University, London School of Economics, New York University, Notre Dame, Syracuse University, and Yale. See Appendix D for a complete list of graduate schools for the Class of 2011.

Of those attending graduate school immediately following graduation, 9% were pursuing Education, 6% Nursing, and 5% Social Work. 3% were studying Engineering and Film, and 2% in Anthropology, Computer Science, Conflict Resolution and Diplomacy, Dance, Fine Arts, and Psychology.

17% of respondents were pursuing J.D., M.D., or Doctoral programs immediately following graduation. 7% of those respondents were studying Law, while others include: Chemistry, Computer Science, Dental Medicine, Historical Musicology, Inorganic Chemistry, Kinesiology, Medicine, Neural Science, Neuroscience, and Psychology.

GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION SUMMARY

Graduates of the Class of 2011 started work or graduate study in 32 different states and 17 foreign countries. 73% of respondents were residing in the Northeast/Mid-Atlantic region, in the Boston to Washington corridor.

New York was by far the most popular state with 45% of graduates residing in that state. Massachusetts was the next most popular destination with 13% of graduates living there.

7% of those tracked lived in California. 3% lived in Connecticut, and 2% live in DC, Illinois, New Hampshire, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. 1% of those tracked were living in each of these areas: Colorado, Florida, Maryland, Maine, Missouri, Ohio, Oregon, South Carolina, Virginia, Vermont, and Washington.

China was the most common location for those working abroad with 17 respondents residing there, followed by 5 in the United Kingdom, and 3 in France. See Appendix F for a complete geographic distribution for the Class of 2011.

GENDER DIFFERENCES

There were some significant differences between the responses of females and males to the survey. Men were more likely to be working in Business (38% vs. 18%) and be self-employed (5% vs. 3%). Women were more likely to be working in Civic Engagement/Human Services (5% vs. 2%), Communications (7% vs. 3%), and Government/Law (5% vs. 4%). Figures for males and females were similar in other areas of employment. Unemployment was higher for males at 4% vs. 2% for females.

Women were more likely to attend graduate school immediately following graduation (19% vs. 8%)
