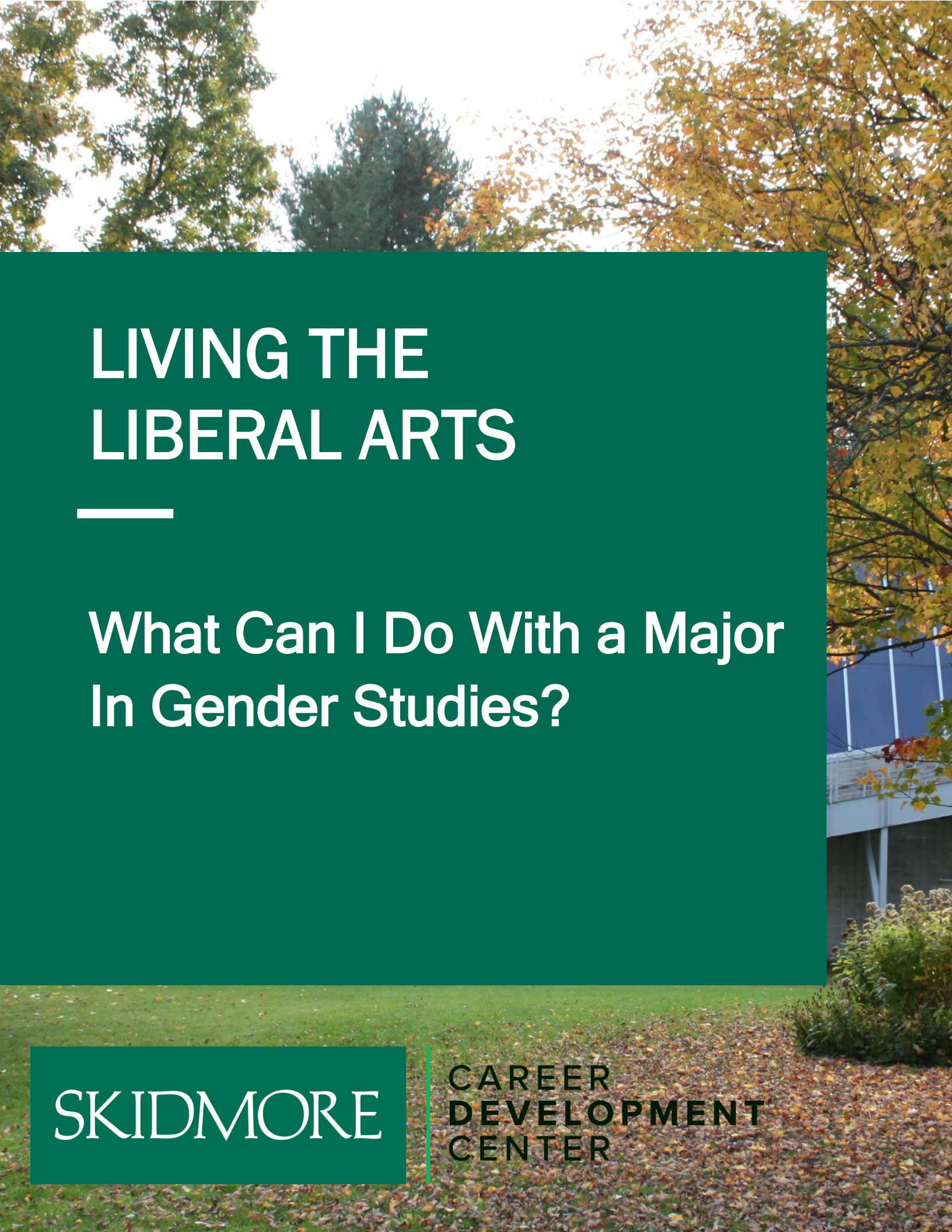

Seek out resources. Don't be afraid to ask for help - that's something my parents always told me, and another skill with which I had to work to get comfortable. When I wanted an important internship in New York City and I had only saved a third of the money required for my initial move, I didn't think I could raise the rest. I had already accepted the internship and I was freaking out. I started a campaign asking for financial help, and two months later I was on a plane to NYC. I've gained so much by simply asking.
