## Committee Activities

During the 2018-2019 Academic Year, the MALSC met five times. The committee reviewed the status of the three students continuing in the program, considered a few issues related to the planned program closure, and discussed the distribution of the 2018 Scholarship award money. The committee distributed \$6,472, with all three students receiving awards.

At three of the meetings, MALS students presented their Final Project Proposals. MALSC approved all three projects and offered feedback to the students. Two of these students graduated in May 2019.

The MALS program is scheduled to close in February 2020. The one student remaining in the program intends to complete requirements for the degree by December 2019. Jacqueline Scoones will continue to work with the remaining student, faculty readers, the MALSC, and the administration through program closure.
