Curriculum Committee started the year by approving the committee's operating code.

The Committee approved a myriad of new courses and course revisions involving twenty one departments and programs. Extensive work included:

- Consideration and approval of revisions of the majors in Anthropology, Asian Studies, Economics, Education Studies, Mathematics and Computer Science, Physics and Psychology,
- Consideration and approval of revisions of the minors in Anthropology, Chinese, Economics, Japanese
- Consideration and approval of catalog language and courses for the Documentary Studies Collaborative
- Consideration and approval of fourteen new Scribner Seminar proposals as well as revision to an existing one.

Curriculum Committee also considered CEPP's proposed revisions to the all-college curriculum and communicated our discussion points and concerns to CEPP.
