Following the merger with Blackboard, this new WebCT has a very different design and feel from its predecessor, WebCT 4.1, and comes with new tools, features, and exciting customizations. This workshop briefly introduces what course management systems are with an emphasis on the new and not-so-new tools found in the new WebCT. There will also be some discussion about how others are using these tools and what they like/dislike.
