Goals for IGR Elective Courses

Courses that fulfill the elective requirement for the IGR minor must include among their goals for students' learning:

- Analyze cultural, institutional, or other systems of power related to race or other social identities.

- Understand the history of race and its consequences in the U.S. or global context;
- Understand individual identities in the context of social systems;
- Understand how race intersects with one or more other social identities;
- Enhance productive communication skills across identity differences.
