Special Circumstances for Student Ratings of Courses and Teaching – Fall 2020

Web Administration

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the shift to delivering instruction via varying methods (In-person, Online, Hybrid, Hyflex), Fall 2020 Student Ratings of Courses and Teaching forms were administered via the web for the first time at Skidmore. Students received emails during the final two weeks of classes (November 9 to 22) asking them to complete the Ratings forms. In addition, The Dean of Faculty's Office sent pre-notification emails about the process to students and faculty the week before.

Response Rates

The overall response rate, as usual, was calculated using all courses where the response rate is > 0%. Twelve (12) courses with no responses (a total of 18 students enrolled) were excluded. The final overall all-College response rate for Fall 2020 was 51.5% (6,277 responses/12,196 enrollments). Although this is lower than the response rates Skidmore obtained via paper forms for past terms (between 89-92%), anecdotal information suggests that many institutions administering ratings online have response rates between 40-55%. The Fall 2020 term response rate is within the range of student response rates that Skidmore College attains in traditional online surveys (NSSE, etc.). When viewing the response rates at the course section level, 43% of course sections had a response rate below 50%. Three-quarters (74%) of courses had a response rate between 30-69%.

Faculty Vote

The faculty voted on a motion presented by CEPP at the Oct 2, 2020 Faculty Meeting.

<u>MOTION</u>: The Committee on Educational Policies and Planning (CEPP) moves that Student Ratings and Feedback surveys (i.e., all-college quantitative forms and departmental long forms) be administered online in Fall 2020, and, furthermore, that the results of these Student Ratings and Feedback forms be provided not only to instructors but also to department chairs and program directors, and, when appropriate, ATC, PC, and the college administration.

The motion to administer Student Ratings online was passed by majority vote. The motion to distribute results to department chairs, program directors, ATC, PC and the college administration failed. Course section results will therefore be distributed only to the faculty member teaching each course section. As there will be no scanning of paper forms (that work was done in the first half of January in the past), a byproduct of web administration is that results should be distributed to faculty slightly earlier than before.



All-College Report

The standard overall Fall 2020 All-College Report follows this preface. When comparing overall question results from Fall 2020 (web administered; lower response rate) to a 3-year prior fall average (paper administered), all-College means in Fall 2020 are -0.08 to -0.11 lower (see table). The Fall 2020 all-College overall question means were not lower than any single prior administration of the current form, first administered in Fall 2013 (see graph), though, due to a trend of slightly increasing means between Fall 2013 and Fall 2019, the Fall 2020 means are closer to those observed in year two (2014-15) of the current form. Fall 2020 means for the 19 individual non-overall questions (e.g., 1.01, 1.02, 3.01, etc.) were -0.04 to -0.12 lower than the 3-year prior fall average (not shown).






All College - Fall 2020 (51.5% Response Rate)




