## Annual Report for the Institutional Review Board 2014-2015

This report describes the activities of the Institutional Review Board (IRB) beginning June 1, 2014 and ending May 31, 2015.

As shown in Table 1, 51 proposals were submitted to the IRB. Most proposals were classified as expedited (49%) or exempt (43%). Four proposals (8%) required full board review by the IRB.
