Special Interest Housing Options

Substance Free-Quiet communities will be limited by space. Preference for Substance Free-Quiet housing will be prioritized over Housemate Preferences. Substance free and quiet environment housing are combined due to space constraints.

Substance Free-Quiet Community

The purpose of the substance-free community is to support all students in their decision to not allow alcohol or other drugs to negatively affect the community in which they live. Further, the substance-free community exists in order to provide students with a comfortable, safe, living environment free from the pressures associated with alcohol and other drugs.

Students living within this community agree to three conditions:

- Not to physically bring drugs and/or alcohol into this community
- Not to enter this community under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol
- Not to bring guests into this area who are under the effects of drugs and/or alcohol

If students who live in this community are found to violate any of these conditions, they may be asked to move out of the community. In addition to the conditions of substance free living, students choosing to live in this area will abide by 24 hour quiet hours.







Spring to Summer Transition

Students housed on campus for Spring 2021 who request and are assigned housing for Summer Session 1 or Summer Session 3 will be permitted to remain on campus for the 2 weeks between the end of classes and start of the summer session. Students who stay for the transition period will be billed at the weekly summer rate.

Students in this situation who do not choose to stay for the transition period and leave campus will be expected to meet and arrange all precautionary quarantine requirements prior to their return to campus for the summer session.

Students not currently housed on campus for Spring 2021 will be expected to arrive for the summer sessions on their assigned move in date.

Students housed on campus for Spring 2021 who are requesting and assigned housing for Summer Session 2 will be expected to depart campus on time and return for the summer session 2 move in date.
