- a. DISCUSSION ON RECLAIMING RESIDENTIAL SPACE FOR STUDENTS WITH DEAN OF STUDENTS AND VICE PRESIDENT FOR STUDENT AFFAIRS ADRIAN BAUTISTA AND ASSISTANT VICE PRESIDENT FOR THE RESIDENTIAL EXPERIENCE CHRISTINA MONTVILLE
 - i. MONTVILLE: QUALITATIVE BRAINSTORM FOR FUTURE APPLICATIONS OF FUTURE RESIDENTIAL EXPERIENCE PROJECTS. IDEAS INCLUDE TELEHEALTH SITES, EASILY ACCESSIBLE PRAYER SITES WITHIN RESIDENTIAL SPACES.
 - ii. S. Lobner: Consideration by students and parents: expanding amount of rooms rather than reclaiming other spaces to reduce amount of triple occupancy residential spaces instead of opening new non-livable spaces.
 - iii. MONTVILLE: PRIORITIZING NEW SPACES THAT ARE LIVABLE BY STUDENTS. HEALTH PROMOTIONS, HEALTH CENTER, AND OTHER OFFICES CURRENTLY IN RESIDENCE HALLS MAY BE RECLAIMED IN THE FUTURE FROM JONSSON TOWER AND WIECKING HALL.
 - iv. S. Chen wondered specifically what and where reclaimable spaces are.
 - v. S. LIPMAN INITIATED A DISCUSSION ABOUT SECURITY OF ITEMS THAT CANNOT BE BROUGHT INTO RESIDENCE HALLS INCLUDING BICYCLES AND SKATEBOARDS.
 - vi. S. Maxwell expressed desire for informal student spaces.

- vii. S. MALLOY CONCURRED AND WONDERED WHY EXISTING INFORMAL SPACES ARE UNDERUTILIZED.
- viii. S. Alvarez suggested using existing study spaces for television and gaming for community building over private calls and furniture storage.
 - ix. S. Flamenbaum suggested transforming segments of Case Center into less academic and more formal zones. This might also include club meeting spaces.
 - x. SENATORS DISCUSSED STANDARDIZATION OF COMMON SPACES ACROSS RESIDENCE HALLS.
 - xi. S. MAJIEDT SUGGESTED THE USE OF BASEMENT SPACES, CASE CENTER, AND DEVELOPMENT OF SEPARATE INFORMAL BUILDINGS FOLLOWING THE MODEL OF HAMILTON COLLEGE.
- xii. S. TEBO SUGGESTED MAKING COMMON SPACES DIFFERENT ACROSS HALLS, ALLOWING STUDENTS TO CHOOSE SETUP BASED ON INTERESTS.

- xiv. S. Sterling suggested keeping board games and recreational items in common residential settings rather than the library.
- xv. S. GRIJALVA DISCUSSED PLAYING WITH THE SPACE OF TRIPLES AND IMPLEMENTATION OF BATHROOMS WITHIN THEM TO MAKE THEM MORE LIVABLE. SUGGESTED MORE MURALS.
