Sociology Writing Checklist

- Grammar and Mechanics
 - Are there any incomplete sentences?
 - How well are commas used?
 - Is the writing very wordy? Be concise
 - Use writing tips on the sociology website
- Strong Thesis
 - Should be made clear fairly early in the paper
 - Are you able to highlight the thesis?
 - Is it obvious what point
- Development of Thesis
 - While the writing aspect of a paper is important, the content is even more important
 - Ask questions like:
 - * Are you using and defining sociological concepts?
 - * Are you using texts and evidence from authors?
 - * Are you quoting?
- Interpretation of concepts
 - Does the writer have a voice?
 - Is the writer interpreting the concepts they present in a way that answers the question and backs up the question?
 - Is there a place for the student to take a creative approach?

PROOFREAD!

- The professors WILL take off points if it is clear that a paper has not been proofread.
- Specifically, look for obvious mistakes like incomplete sentences or sentences that maybe should have been deleted or are awkward.
